Activity: NATO Phonetic Alphabet

The NATO phonetic alphabet is a series of code words representing each letter that are clearly understood regardless of language differences and ensures there is no misunderstanding if there is radio distortion when pilots are communicating.

Air traffic controllers use these code words to identify aircraft (like a registration number on a car)
